CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

- Refer to General Conditions of Entry & Show Rules.
- All work must have been executed by the Exhibitor and must be the original work of the Exhibitor in concept and execution.
- All exhibits must not have been previously entered in the Atherton Show in any section.
- Sale of Exhibits: No exhibit will be offered for sale during show.
- Class Cards are to be clearly displayed on the front of exhibits.
- Entries are limited to three (3) per exhibitor per Class.
- Exhibits in Open Classes will not be accepted unless they are properly framed and have D-shackles and strong wire attached for hanging.
- The Judge's decision regarding Classification of entries will be final.
- Some Prizes in this section are given as Gift Vouchers instead of cash.
- Please advise the Show Officials of any entries entered but not delivered for judging.
- If a written Judge's Critique is required, please ask for this when delivering the exhibit.
- All exhibits to be clearly marked on the back with the Exhibitor's name, full address, phone number, section and class number, title, date painted, and method of return.
- Exhibits delivered after closing dates will not be accepted.
- Paint a Garden Ornament – Item can also be any other garden fantasy creature. Can be painted, decorated, or embellished. May be brand new or recycled. Ornaments to be no taller than 50cm. There is no limit to the number of entries. A variety of ornaments can be purchased from the Atherton Show Office.

How to mount junior exhibits

- Mount Junior Art entries on heavy cardboard.
- Exhibits in Junior Classes must be mounted on a ridged backing.
- Cord or wire suitable for hanging must be firmly attached. Do not use sticky tape or blu-tac to attach cord to mounting. Cord attached through punched holes is preferred.
- Please indicate the top of the entry on the back of the exhibit.
- Exhibits which are not correctly mounted or hung will be rejected by the stewards.
